Tonight: Isolated showers and thunderstorms before 8pm. Partly cloudy, with a low around 73. South Southwest wind between 7 and 10 mph.

THREAT ANALYSIS

More than two-dozen attendees at the "Electric Daisy Carnival" rave in Texas were hospitalized for dehydration, drug and alcohol use and heat-related issues, and, unfortunately, one 19 year-old man died. A review of several event sites confirms that raves continue to occur in Indiana, with one example being "Mojostock 2011" a two-day rave scheduled for July 29th and 30th at Sleepybear Campground in Noblesville.

ACTION STEPS

Dehydration is one of the biggest threats to ravers, especially in hot weather

[1] Review club drugs and be prepared to treat dehydration. While people attend raves to enjoy the music and social interaction, some attend with the intention to engage in the use of club drugs. The use of these drugs, especially when combined with Indiana summer heat and humidity, could lead to disastrous consequences. Two sources for more information on club drug use at raves are:
